Tells why or when something happens.



Tells when something happens.


Says something different is true.


Shows 2 things happening at once.


I feel happy when I see my friends.

Happens when following something else.


Happens earlier than something else.

Brush your teeth before you go to bed.



Tells when something happens.







Happens when following something else.


