Printing Tip

Print pages 2 and 3 back-to-back so the rules are on the back of the game board.



1001 and you're out

How to Play:

- •Players take turns rolling a dice.
- •Each turn, both players decide if their number represents 'ones', 'tens' or 'hundreds'. For instance, if a player rolls a 5, they can choose to use it as 5 ones (5) or 5 tens (50) or 5 hundreds (500). Players do not have to use the number in the same way. One player may decide to place the number in the tens column while the other player may use it in the ones column.
- •Players record their choice in the appropriate column: ones, tens or hundreds. If using 5 as 5 tens, write 50 in the Number column and add it to the Total column.

Player Turns:

- •After both players have written their number in their table Player 2 rolls the dice.
- •Each players decides where they want the new number to go the ones, tens or hundreds column and records it. They also add their number to the Total column, updating the cumulative total.

Game Progression:

- •Players continue alternating turns for six rolls.
- •Once a number is written, it cannot be changed, adding a layer of strategy to the game.

Winning the Game:

The goal is to have a total as close to 1000 as possible without going over. The player whose sum is closest to 1000 after all six rounds wins the game.
