In Chinese mythology, carp turn into dragons after swimming upstream against a waterfall named Dragon's Castle.

On this day, carp or Koi kites are flown on poles outside houses. A black fish represents the father and a red one the mother, then a fish for each boy in the family. Families make origami warriors' helmets and decorate them with Iris leaves. People eat a special sweet made of rice wrapped in an oak leaf.
